This month we have guest speaker **Dr Paul Skerratt**

The evenings topic: The science of medicine has enjoyed remarkable success over the past 100 years, playing a significant role in effectively doubling the life expectancy of the population. In spite of this, alternative therapies such as homeopathy and acupuncture remain popular, with around 15% of the British people spending £46 million per year on homeopathic remedies alone. Using homeopathy as an example, Dr Paul Skerratt from the University of Hull will provide a critique of alternative therapies and ask if they really deserve a place in modern medicine.
