### Year 5 Homework

For my homework I baked a Victorian bread pudding. I would like to share this with you because you may like to try it for yourself.

#### BREAD PUDDING (Fill Belly).

450 grams stale bread.

175 grams dried fruit.

2 tablespoons milk.

175 grams margarine.

125 grams sugar.

1 level teaspoon mixed spice.

2 eggs.

Cut bread and crusts. put to soak in cold water for about ½ hour.

Drain and squeeze out water.

Add dry ingredient, then eggs and melted marg.

Mix well.

Put into greased dish. Bake for about 1 hour middle shelf.200c gas 6 .400f.
